Safety Tips

- ◆ Map out the route you plan on taking
- ◆ Bring a flashlight to light your path
- ◆ Don't enter a stranger's house or vehicle
- ◆ Only visit homes with porch lights
- ◆ Younger kids should always be with an adult
- ◆ Older kids should walk with a group
- ◆ Use face paints instead of masks, less restrictive for sight & breathing
- ◆ Wear light colored clothing and use reflective tape & stickers in multiple places on your costume and bags to maximize visibility
- ◆ Walk, don't run. Cross at corners & look both ways before crossing
- ◆ Wigs, capes & costumes are flammable, so beware of open flames
- ◆ Approach houses on sidewalks, don't walk across lawns
- ◆ Be cautious of animals, especially dogs that might be easily spooked



It is the time of year to get yards cut and gardens cleaned up, cut down dead and diseased trees and trim limbs before the snow weights them down and damages the trees or pulls down power lines during a snowstorm. These items can be disposed of at the City compost dump for no charge in their respective areas. Please empty any plastic or paper bags of leaves as paper & plastic bags are not permitted at the compost. It is prohibited to blow or sweep leaves or grass clippings into the streets.

Lighting

LED lighting incentives are provided for commercial and industrial customers that upgrade fluorescent, mercury vapor, metal halide or high-pressure sodium lighting to LED technology. New LED products must be DLC-listed. DLC stands for Design Lights Consortium and most utilities require their certification on LED products to qualify for incentives. This certification ensures customers their lighting provides quality, warranty and a high level of energy efficiency.

Variable Frequency Drives

Commercial and industrial customers can receive an incentive to install variable frequency drives (VFDs) on centrifugal fans and pumps. The incentive is \$30 per horsepower for VFDs from 1 to 200 horsepower, operating a minimum of 2,000 hours annually.

Commercial HVAC

Incentives are provided to commercial and industrial customers for installing high efficiency HVAC equipment via a prescriptive program where the incentive is calculated based on the specific efficiency improvement.

HVAC System Optimization

Incentives are provided to commercial and industrial customers for improving the efficiency of their existing heating, cooling and ventilating systems.

Industrial Process Incentive

Incentives are provided to industrial customers for improving the efficiency of their processes.

Prescriptive Irrigation

Customers can receive \$500 for replacing all sprinkler components on older qualifying center pivots.

Custom Irrigation

Customers can receive reimbursement for a system efficiency test on their irrigation systems and for modifications leading to efficiency improvements.

Agricultural Efficiency

Customers can receive reimbursement for installing electric heating mats in their hog farrowing operations. Incentives range from \$40 to \$80 per mat.
