Just a friendly reminder for all walking key holders & renters.

- ◆ The key owner **must** be present at all times. **Do not** loan keys to others.
- ◆ An adult must be present with persons under 19 years of age.
- ◆ Turn off all lights in restrooms, kitchen, gym and front carpeted area of the building prior to leaving the building.
- ◆ **Clean up all messes & take out all trash** prior to leaving the building.
- ◆ **Lock all doors** prior to leaving the building. This is your responsibility.

Introducing a new EnergyWiseSM program! The Induction Cooking program offers a 20% incentive to those who purchase an induction cooktop or range with a minimum width of 30". This program, along with updates to other programs (Smart Thermostat, Prescriptive Lighting, Corner Pivot VFD, Lawn and Garden and EVs), is effective beginning January 1st, 2022.

Induction Cooktop (new program)

- 20% incentive for minimum if 30" width cooktop or range

Lawn & Garden

- Incentive from 10% to 20% on any new battery powered or corded electric lawn mower

Electric Vehicle Incentives

Electric Vehicle and ChargePoint Charging Station

- \$4,000 incentive for the purchase of a new battery electric vehicle
- No longer linked to home charging station

Smart Thermostat

- The incentive for a self-installed thermostat is limited to 50% of purchase price (before sales tax or shipping)

Commercial/Industrial Prescriptive Lighting

- The incentive for self-install lighting is limited to 50% of purchase price (before sales tax or shipping)
- Requires upgrading existing fluorescent or HID to DLC-listed LED
- New construction, downlighting and LED-to-LED are not eligible

Corner Pivot VRD

- The incentive is increasing from \$12/hp to \$18/hp for a VFD installed on a center pivot with a corner system

City Compost Area

Items **NOT** permitted at the compost are as follows:

Plastics	Construction Debris	Residential Trash	Batteries
Old Furniture	Hazardous Waste	Tires	Propane Tanks

Only grass clippings, leaves, garden waste and tree branches are permitted at the compost dump area.

The compost area is provided for free to city residents and licensed by the State of Nebraska. If non-permitted items are found during a State inspection, the city would be fined and would have to resort to charging residents to have access to this area. Please help us to continue to provide this service for free by doing your part as a citizen of the Sutton community.
