# **City Compost Area**

Items **NOT** permitted at the compost are as follows:
Plastics Construction Debris
Residential Trash Batteries
Old Furniture Hazardous Waste
Tires Propane Tanks

**Only** grass clippings, leaves, and garden waste are permitted at the compost dump area. Tree limbs and branches are only allowed in the tree dump area.

The compost area is provided for free to city residents and licensed by the State of Nebraska. If non-permitted items are found during a State inspection, the city would be fined and would have to resort to charging residents to have access to this area. Please help us to continue to provide this service for free by doing your part as a citizen of the Sutton community.

## **Sutton Recycling**

The recycling trailers are located behind George's 66 fueling station .The items collected in these trailer's are as follows:

- #1 & #2 Plastic-They will have a symbol located on or near the bottom. Please rinse out before recycling.
- <u>Tin or aluminum cans</u>—please rinse out
- <u>Cardboard</u>—please break cardboard down into flat pieces
- Bagged or bundled Newspapers picked up curbside the 1st Saturday of the each month. Please don't leave lose papers outside.

#### **Nuisances**

With the weather continuing to feel like spring (with only brief days of traditional winter weather) everyone is feeling the urge to begin spring clean up. You wouldn't invite rodents, wild animals, or insects into your home, but letting grass and weeds grow unchecked, refuse lying around, dead tress and tree limbs, unused or nonworking appliances, unused furniture, construction material waste, and improperly stored firewood among other nuisances are a bright neon welcome sign to unwanted visitors. Once these unwanted guests decide to make themselves at home, it can be extremely

difficult to remove them. Lack of proper maintenance of structures (home or otherwise) on a property can lead to nuisance issues, not to mention the potential to be a safety hazard! It is the responsibility of all property owners and renters to keep their property free from keeping properties nuisances by compliance with local ordinances. **Cemetery Regulation Reminders** 

Non-permanent decorations are allowed during a funeral, burial, Memorial Day and the Christmas Season. To help prevent damage to headstones or injury to cemetery staff, these types of items are not allowed throughout the year. Examples are: Decorative Rocks (with sayings), Figurines, Plaques (with writing or pictures, w/o stands), Shepherd hooks (plus any item hanging from them) and Solar

Lights. Any flowers and non-permanent decorations WILL need to be removed or they will be picked up by the city staff for regular summer cemetery mowing and grounds keeping.

When flowers, wreaths, emblems or other items become unsightly or inappropriate, they will be removed by the cemetery staff. The City assumes no responsibility for the protection or maintenance of those items. The City reserves the right to remove any and all unsightly or inappropriate objects from cemetery lots. Planting flowers is not allowed on or around the graves.

Examples of unsightly or inappropriate decorations are as follows:

Alcoholic beverages Glass jars or bottles Tin or aluminum cans Banners or banner hangers Flowers (faded, torn, tattered or broken) Plant decorations with REAL GRAIN attached Metal art (staked, non-staked,

painted or non-painted)

Wind decorations (chimes, bells, spinners, etc.) Produce (seasonally decorated or natural) Bucket containers (plastic or metal)

Sports Equipment, clothing or flags

Decorative letters (spelling out nicknames)
